Eye contact	Student(s) maintains eye contact with audience, seldom referring to notes.	Student(s) maintains some eye contact, but frequently refers to notes.	Student(s) reads from notes with little or no eye contact.	
Elocution	Student(s) uses a clear voice and correct, precise pronunciation of terms so that all audience members can hear presentation.	Student's(s)' voice is mostly clear; student(s) pronounces most words correctly; most audience members can hear presentation.	Student(s) mumbles, incorrectly pronounces terms, and speaks too quietly for many students to hear.	
Preparedness	Student(s) is completely prepared with regard to materials and has obviously rehearsed.	Student(s) does not have all materials adequately prepared; may need a couple more rehearsals.	Student(s) are not at all prepared to present.	
Subject/content knowledge	Student(s) demonstrates full knowledge (more than required) by answering all class questions with explanations and elaboration.	Student(s) is capable of answering most questions; however, incorrect statements were made and/or teacher intervention was required.	Student(s) does not have grasp of information; student(s) cannot answer questions about subject.	
Total Group Effort	All students worked as a cohesive unit and equally participated in an enthusiastic manner.	Most students participated in the presentation, but some members appeared to be non-existent.	Few students effectively participated in the presentation.

Information	Contains information that clearly explains all aspects of the experiment and reinforces the presentation. Neatness	Extremely neat and meticulously constructed; project appears to have taken a lot of time and effort.	Neatly put together, but does have the potential to be neater.	Messy project that appears to have been completed at the last minute. ☐	
Creativity	Original; uses the unexpected to full advantage; uniquely made visual aid.	Some originality apparent; good variety and blending of materials/media.	Little or no variation; material presented with little originality; predictable	
Organization	Information arranged in a logical, interesting sequence which audience can follow.	Information arranged in a logical manner; however, there are some sequencing issues.	Information arranged in a confusing and disorganized manner.	
Mechanics	No misspellings or grammatical errors.	Has one to two misspellings and/or grammatical errors.	Has three or more misspellings and/or grammatical errors.
